Our BRL boys were also very courageous and couple of their wins were really memorable and against the odds.



PETER LEIS MEDAL & SENIOR AWARDS NIGHT



Redcliffe Dolphins fan favourite Trai Fuller won the Peter Leis Medal, the star fullback, renowned for his fearless and electric style of play, was named the club's Peter Leis Player of the Year Medallist and Tony Obst Players' Player at the event held at Redcliffe Leagues Club. It comes off the back of Fuller's breakthrough year with the NRL side, playing 11 games and placing third in the club's count for NRL Player of the Year.

At each Host Plus Cup match three judges allocate votes on a 3-2-1 basis to the players they judge to be the best three players on the field for the Dolphins. There's 18 points up grabs after each Intrust Super Cup game. These votes are kept under lock and key until after the final competition game and this year it went down to the wire. The winner of the medal will also take home a Royal Caribbean Cruise travel voucher to go with the specially crafted Peter Leis medal. This year's count came down to the very last round of the year, round 23, with 2 points between first and fourth going into the last round.

The awards night was a chance to celebrate the seasons of the club's QCup and BRL teams, with the QCup side making the grand final and the BRL side finishing second on the ladder. Ben Te'o praised the QCup and BRL players for their effort this season, with 20 players making their QCup debuts this season. BRL team coach Chris Little said there was a one-squad mentality at the club, which had been beneficial to his team.

The awards evening was also a chance to farewell long-time player Nathan Watts, 28, who started as a junior with the club and is now retiring. He debuted with the QCup side in 2017, has since made 109 appearances and was the last remaining player from the 2018 premiership team.







team. Their enthusiasm and commitment set a great example for the children and


fostered a sense of community within the team. We are incredibly grateful for their time and effort, which made this season an enjoyable and rewarding experience for everyone involved.

done it without him.




U16 DIV 4



What a great season we had, with battling the school footy program putting the lads under huge workloads they just kept turning up for each other in that's what being a Redcliffe Dolphin is all about.


There were many highlights throughout the season. A standout being in that we lost 2 x consecutive games to top teams early in the season and we turned it around in the back half of the season to come away winners...


Our priority was being in a defensive mindset & defending for each other. We worked out early in the season that if our defence was in order we had the talent and speed for our attack to look after itself.
