PETER LEIS MEDAL & SENIOR AWARDS NIGHT

Redcliffe Dolphins players, partners and supporters have celebrated the 2025 season, which saw the club win the BRL premiership and come agonisingly close to a Grand Final berth in the Hostplus Cup.

Chairman Bob Jones said there was much to celebrate about the season, with the club again showing they are a force to be reckoned with. "It's always good to celebrate premiership wins and in only our second year back (in the competition) ... Dunamis and his men won in style," Jones said. The BRL team beat Carina 32-12 in the Grand Final following a disrupted start to the season, under first-time Head Coach and former player Dunamis Lui.

His efforts in guiding the team to the premiership win and his impact on the broader Redcliffe Dolphins club earned him the Des Webb Memorial Award Club Person of the Year.

Lui said it was difficult to build momentum, but he's proud of his team - the way they handled the challenge and won the competition. And he achieved his goal for the season ... "Apart from just having a good season, I'd be lying if I said it wasn't to win the comp," he said. "We got to do that in the end but even if we didn't do that, I think I'd still be pretty proud of the boys."

The Hostplus Cup side made it to the preliminary final but fell agonisingly short against the Burleigh Bears 18-16. The Bears went on to win the Grand Final at Kayo Stadium, defeating Norths Devils 22-8. Our QCup boys showed how close we were to winning the comp... we were clearly the better side, only to fall a bit short in the last few minutes.

Hostplus Cup Head Coach Eric Smith said he was proud of his players and staff. "The Prelim is going to sting for a little while ... it still stings now, especially seeing what Burleigh were able to go on and do the week after," he said. "It just wasn't to be on the day. Grand Finals are really hard to win and they're even harder to get there." Smith said it was important players and staff reflected on all the moments and achievements throughout the season, not just on that final game. "There are a lot of things that happen throughout a season that make it a success," he said. He added the last six weeks of the season were "some of the best football I've been involved in (Queensland Cup)".

Dolphins Prop Josh Allen, won the Tony Obst Players Player Award and Peter Leis Medal for Player of the Year (61 points).

This year we had 4 teams representing Redcliffe Dolphins: Harvey Norman U17 Females, Harvey Norman U19 Females, Cyril Connell U17 Males, Mal Meninga U19 Males. Harvey Norman U17 Female comp was the same format as the HN19, consisting only of 7 rounds inclusive of a Bye and Semi Finals. Thank you to Joe Oloapu, his Staff and players for representing the Dolphins, winning 2 games out of 5 with the last round being washed out which was a shame as they were just starting to hit their straps, majority of these players will return for season 2026.

Harvey Norman U19 Females was a 7-round comp consisting also of a Bye round. Thank you to Steve Crawford & Jason Goulding, their Staff and players for their efforts, we Won 2, Lost 3, unfortunately the final game was also washed out. These female Junior Rep competitions are now a full competition which provide a great development pathway for females, and we are seeing more and more development in this area.

Cyril Connell U17 Males this year was quite challenging as the majority of the squad where a year younger but competed in majority of their matches with players showing improvement in each game. Players now know what it takes to compete at this level in these competitions and I'm sure that this experience will put them in good stead for next season. To Chris Little, his Staff and players, thank you for your efforts this season.

Each year the Mal Meninga U19 Male Competition continues to improve with the players getting more skilful & stronger and the gap closing between the teams. Our Mal Meninga team played 9 rounds finishing the regular season with 7 wins & 2 Loses. They finished in 2 nd spot resulting in them having a bye in the first week of the semi-finals. The Preliminary semi-final was against Mackay Cutters @ Kayo Stadium, our Boys put together a faultless display in the first half going into halftime 34 - 4 which the Mackay Cutters never recovered from, final score 42 - 14.

Grand Final v Burleigh Bears - Coming into the match, the Dolphins and Bears were slated with equal chances of victory, though the Bears' side entered the game notably more experienced, having been defeated in the Grand Final last year. It would be the Dolphins striking first through centre Seth Carpenter, racing out to a 4-nil lead after five minutes.

Despite the early try, the first half points would remain static after Carpenter's four-pointer, with both defences showing great resilience on their own lines, neither the Dolphins nor Bears giving an inch. As both teams took to the pitch for the second half, the energy in the stadium remained rather pedestrian following a gritty defensive display in the opening thirty-five minutes.

However, a double for Bears' winger Disharne Tonihi within five minutes would bring Kayo Stadium back to life, with the Bears pushing their noses in front 8-4. After a much-needed return serve from Dolphins' winger Callum Bowles, scores would be level once more at 8-a-piece, as gale force winds proved a major headache for conversation takers on both teams. Another unsuccessful conversion attempt following a brilliant try finished by Hayden Watson would be rectified with a penalty goal taken with five minutes left, putting the Bears up six-points - a likely death knell for the Dolphins considering the conditions.

However, in the final play of regular time, crafty hooker Braelan Marsh would scoot over from dummy-half, reducing the deficit by two and passing the onus on to fullback Reeco Kirk, who had the most important conversion of his career ahead of him. As the full-time siren rung out, a pin drop could be heard in the stadium as Kirk settled himself for the do-or-die kick. Composed, Kirk stepped up and laced the Steeden. With the ball starting its trajectory appearing to be flying over the black dot, it became caught in the left-to-right wind, straying right and smashing the inside of the right-upright, falling just over the crossbar and levelling the scores 14-14. Thankfully for fans, and unthankfully for the players - the bona-fide horror movie would continue providing drama after regulation time had finished. As both sides dealt blows to one another, the final set of the first extra-time would result in a penalty for the Bears, forty metres out from the Dolphins try-line and ten metres in from the right touchline.

Hayden Watson struck the ball clean as a whistle, with the ball's trajectory once again slated for success, before being caught in the wind and leathering the right up-right once more. This time however, the ball ricocheted away from the crossbar, hitting the ground and being desperately thrown over touch by the Dolphins. Second extra-time it is.

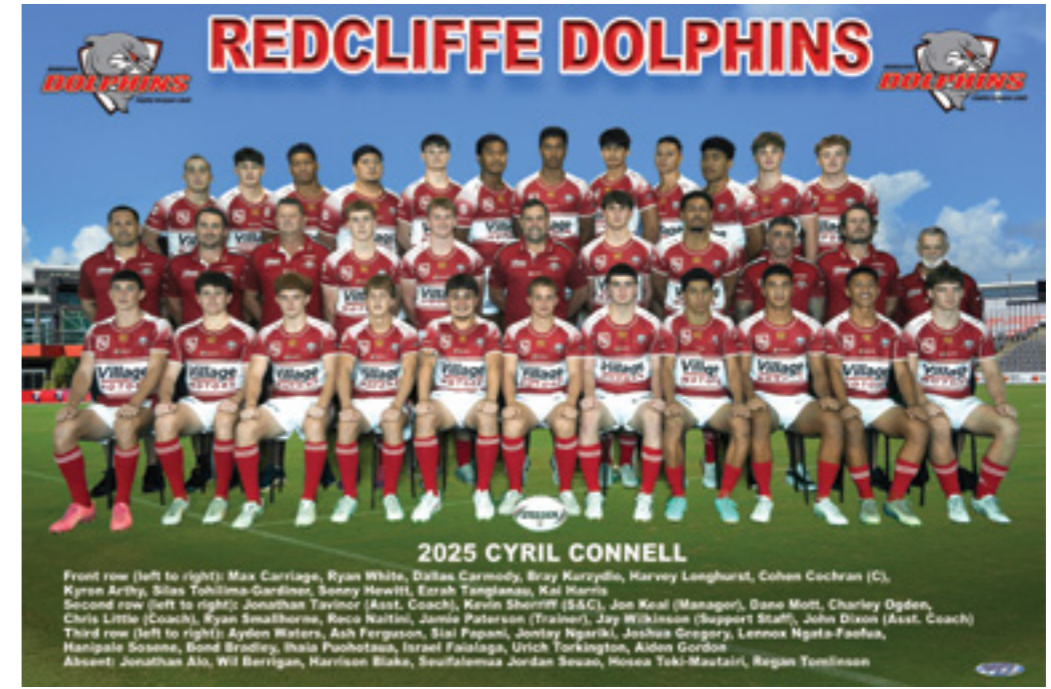

Burleigh Lock, Anton Whaiapu followed up in support as Francis approached Redcliffe's fullback - and a successful draw and pass would see Whaiapu cross the line for the match-winning try.

Burleigh were crowned victors 18-14.



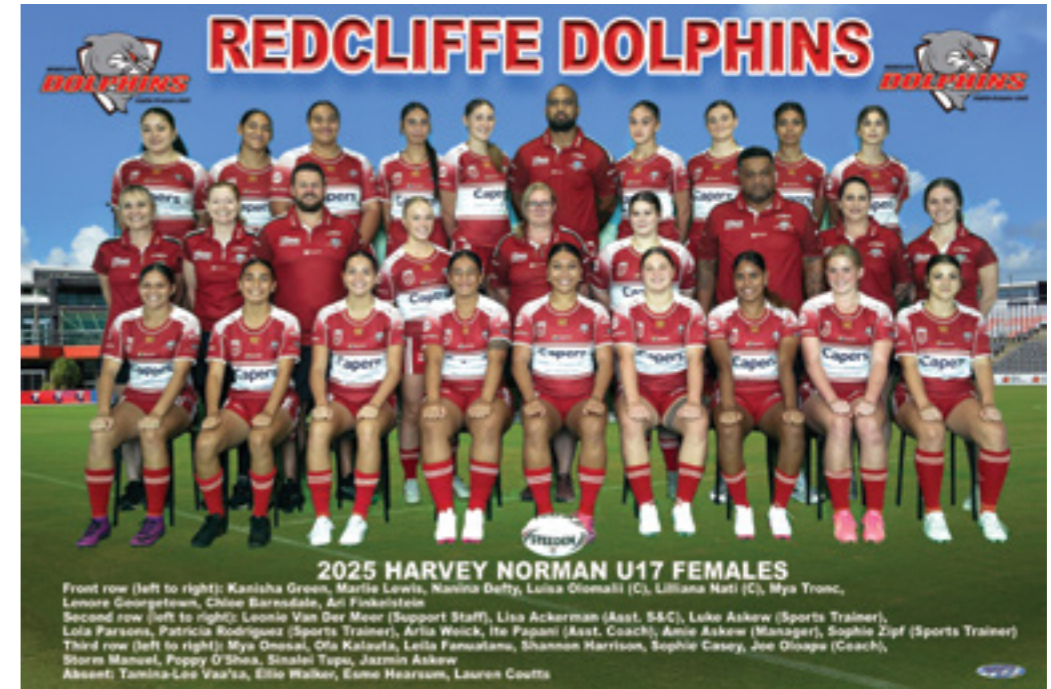

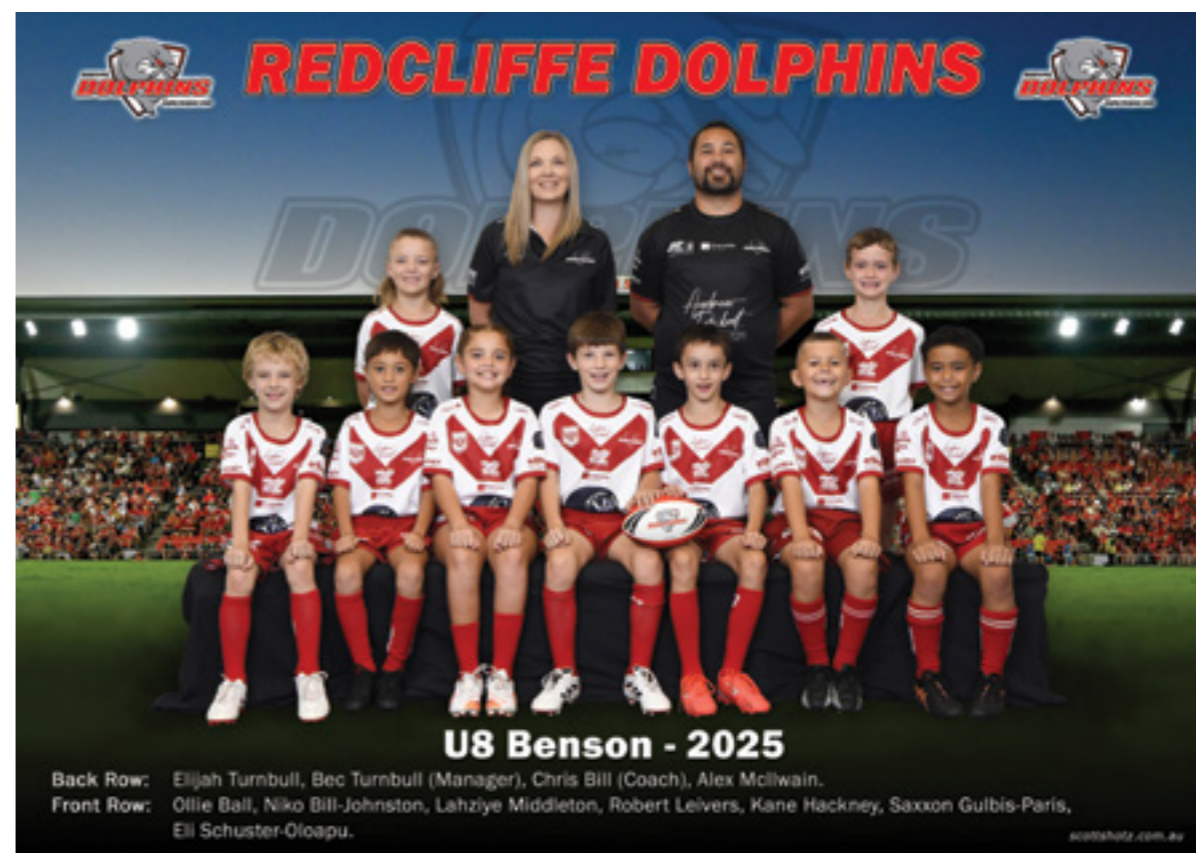

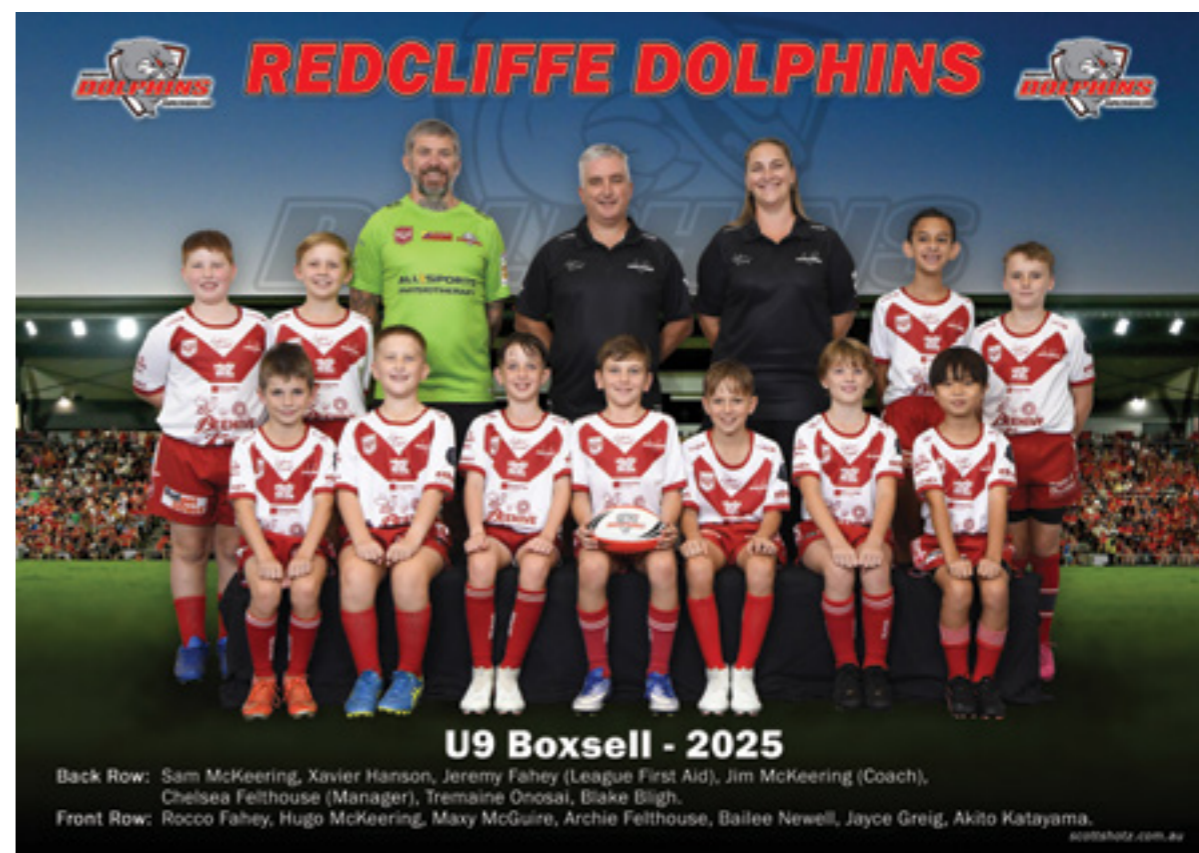

I look forward to seeing everyone again next season.

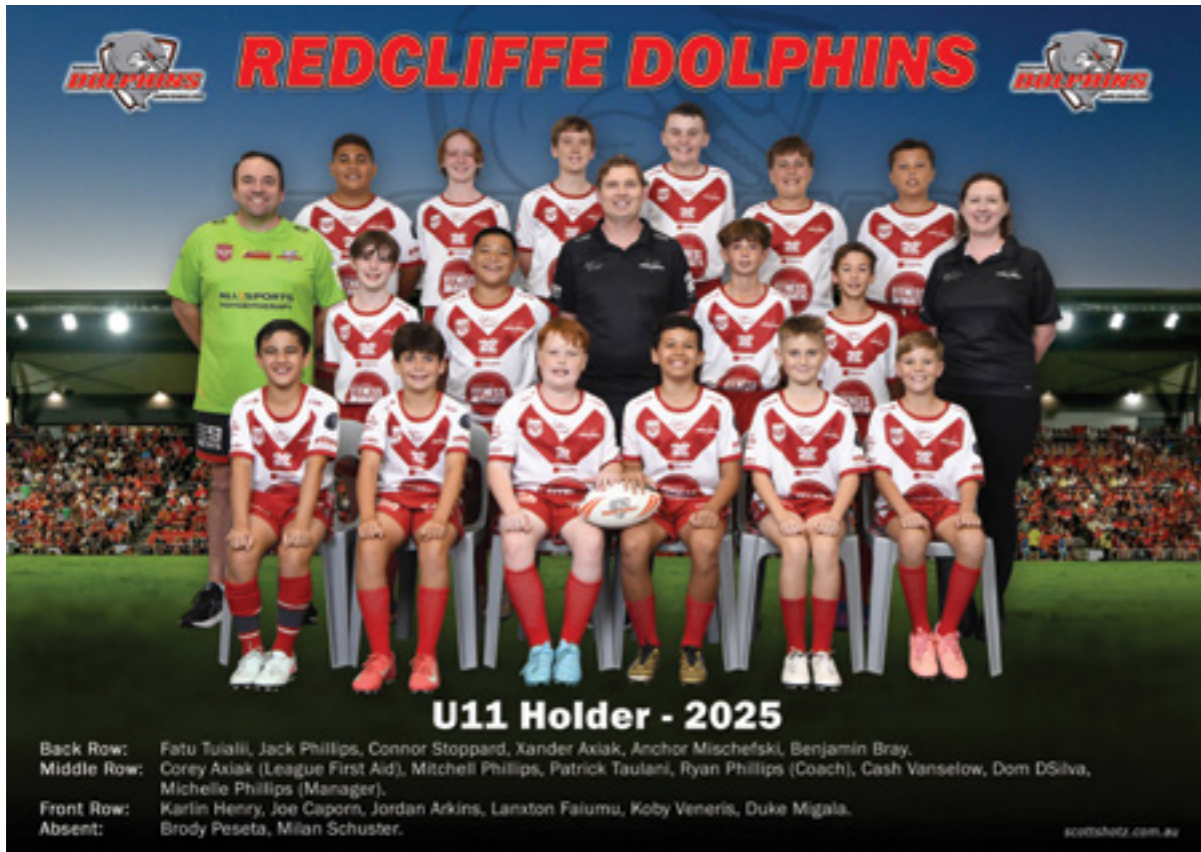
